Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

1. By the end of FY24, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the “Proficient” and “Distinguished” levels of performance.
2. Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year) to decrease the number of OSS days in grades 6-12.

School Goals and Focus Areas

1. By the end of FY2024, the percentage of students meeting projected Reading growth as measured by MAP will be at least 50% (11% increase).
2. By the end of FY2024, the percentage of students meeting projected Math growth as measured by MAP will be at least 60% (5% increase).
3. During FY2024, 100% of homerooms will implement Sources of Strength lessons weekly with fidelity as measured by lesson plans.
