READING	Read out loud to a stuffed animal or family member and write a summary of what you read.	Write a book review or create an advertisement to convince others to read your favorite book.	As you read, find 3-5 words that you aren't familiar with. Try to define them using context clues.
WRITING	Tell a story about a pair of lost mittens who find themselves in a winter adventure. Draw a picture to go with your story.	Write letters or create postcards to give to 3 family members or friends.	Write a sentence using each of your spelling words (studying, feeling, pointed, recommended, scratching, waited, carried, using, laugh, first)
MATH	Practice math skills with cooking measurements or counting coins.	Write your multiplication and/or division facts for numbers 1-10. You may make flashcards or write them on paper.	Create 4 word problems that your classmates could solve using addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division.
SCIENCE/ SOCIAL STUDIES	Teach your family about being a good citizen.	Record the temperature and weather conditions each hour from 8am-2pm.	Write a paragraph about the importance of Martin Luther King, Jr.
CREATIVITY	Draw a 3-circle snowman on a piece of white paper. Add details to make it into something different. Be sure to add a creative title.	Work on jigsaw puzzles, brain teasers, or card games that challenge critical thinking.	Print the word snowflake on white paper. Add details to make them into an interesting design.
