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Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals 2025-2026

Goal 1: By the end of FY26, the percentage of all students moving into the “Proficient and Distinguished” (combined) levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2%.

Goal 2: By the end of FY26, increase the percentage of referred students who access school based mental health services in order to increase the overall school climate rating for HCSD by 1% (from 86.74 to 87.74).

School Goals 2025-2026

Goal 1: By the end of FY 2026, at least 50% of students will meet projected Reading achievement as measured by MAP.

Goal 2: By the end of FY 2026, at least 50% of students will meet projected Math achievement as measured by MAP.

Goal 3: During FY 2026, 100% of students will have the opportunity to participate in bimonthly SEL lessons from the guidance counselor to understand their social-emotional needs and equip them with strategies to increase their social-emotional health.

School/Teacher Responsibilities:

- An electronic school newsletter is sent at each month to communicate information about learning and events for the month.
- Host a curriculum night for parents to learn how to help their children be successful with homework, develop healthy study habits, and access a multitude of resources to support learning in each academic content area.
- Hold regular parent workshops to provide strategies to support students’ academic learning at home.
- Provide access to Canvas, the district learning management system, as additional support for students and families at home.
- Provide parents with reasonable access to staff to discuss their child’s progress as well as the opportunity to schedule parent-teacher conferences.

Family Responsibilities:

- Encourage my child to read at home every night.
- Help my child practice math facts.
- Practice counting routines.
- Use strategies taught in workshops to assist in my child’s academic progress.

Student Responsibilities:

- Read at home 20 minutes.
- Practice math facts and counting with my family.
- Follow the Bulldog Way.
